



For the Legal Profession

If you or your Law Societyⁱ assesses that the course content of this Conference is relevant to your immediate or long term needs in relation to your professional development and practice of the law, then you may be able to claim the activity for mandatory continuing legal education (CPD) units/points.

The table **below** represents the basis upon which each State or Territoryⁱⁱ assesses CPD unit/points for its individual members for their attendance at and participation in approved CPD Activitiesⁱⁱⁱ.

ACT	Attendance or Presentation at or Preparation for a workshop, lecture, conference, educational program, discussion group, multi-media or web-based program, recorded material (eg. audio/video/dvd) - Unlimited, except max. 5 units for recorded material. 1 hour = 1 unit.
NSW	Attendance at and/or presentation of papers at conferences, conventions or seminars - 1 MCLE(CPD) unit per hour for a maximum of 5 MCLE (CPD) units for any one course
NT	Attending at a seminar or preparing or giving a presentation – 0.5 CPD points per 30 minutes attendance or 0.5 CPD points per 30 minutes preparing or giving the presentation – No limit
QLD	Attending seminars, conferences, workshops and lectures (including video conferences and web streamed conferences and seminars) – 1 unit = 1 hour – No limit
SA	Attendance at, or preparing or presenting material for, a seminar, workshop, lecture, conference, educational program or course or discussion group – 1 hour of CPD activity = 1 CPD unit
TAS	Attendance at, or preparing or presenting material for, a seminar, workshop, lecture, conference, educational program or course or discussion group; 1 CPD Unit = 1 hour of CPD activity
VIC	Attending seminars and lectures =1 CPD unit per hour (maximum 6 units per day); Preparing and presenting law seminars = 1 CPD unit per hour (maximum 5 units)
WA	Approved CPD Activity Participant 0.5 points for each complete 30 minutes Presenter 1.5 points for each complete 30 minutes Commentator 1 point for each complete 30 minutes Chair 0.5 points for each complete 30 minutes

Most of the Law Societies allow for a self-assessment approach to the CPD allocation, however you may want to check with your individual Society in case the assessment requires a formal application in accordance with the respective practicing and MCLE (CPD) rules.

^{iv} Each state or territory Bar Association will have its' own criteria for CPD assessment, including the requirement for the Association to allocate a course code in order for it to allocate CPD points. This will require an assessment of the course content by the Association, not by the legal practitioner (you). We recommend you make application for assessment ahead of the conference, if this is the case.
